### What's Happened With Our Family in 2008?

#### Well, a lot.

Aaron, now 20, is still at Trader Joe's, and enjoying his job. He bought his first car and is learning all the challenges that go along with car ownership. Driving in the snow and ice has been an unexpected experience for him over the past few days. He plans to serve as a missionary for two years in the very near future, and then attend BYU Idaho. Aaron and Adam both played on the church volleyball team that advanced to regional play this year.

Garrison is now 15, and his love for, and skill with, the guitar grows daily, and he's still enjoying the piano. He and Jackson like to play guitar together. He attends early morning seminary, and has a near perfect attendance record. This is a very big accomplishment for Garrison. He participated in a church Dance Festival in May of this year and has been excited to go to every church dance since then.

Christian (11) asked to go to public school this year, and is in the 5th grade at Kent Mountain View Academy. He struggled with the homework load initially, but we hope that he's turned that corner. He played flag football this year, as well as baseball and basketball. Christian played catcher for most of the season for his team. He turned 11 in October and started Boys Scouts. He also got his Arrow of Light award - the highest award in Cub Scouting.

Rylan (9) is becoming a great reader. He also played basketball and baseball this year. In fact, he and Christian were on the same excellent baseball team this year. Rylan played outfield for his team for most of the season. Rylan and Garrison enjoyed a week at Grandma's house in California in the summer. The airplane



ticket was Rylan's birthday present. He is enjoying playing the piano a lot more this year. He loves to invent contraptions for his room.

Jackson (8) is growing as a pianist and as a guitarist. He really wants to play the drums. He is also becoming a great reader. Jackson played his 2nd year of baseball this year and is super fast. He could hardly wait to start Cub Scouts in December. He considers Aaron his best friend and is full of joy and laughter.

Tori (4) is the princess. She is constantly getting into mischief. She is truly adorable, however, so it's hard to stay mad at her for too long. She finally potty trained early this year. She loves getting new clothes, especially for her dollies, and her favorite color is pink. She is enjoying her Sunbeam class at church. She loves to sing and dance especially when she can sing on "Rock Band" with her brothers or dad. Tori got an Easy Bake Oven for her birthday and loves using it as well as helping Mom cook.

Adam hurt his knee last year while in China, and did rehab for several months after we returned home. After thinking the knee was healthy enough, Adam joined a basketball league. During the first game he tore his meniscus and had to have surgery to repair it in January. Because of the months of the knee bothering him, his weight skyrocketed to an all time high of 278 pounds. During his post surgery rehab, Adam was pre-

paring for an intense diet and exercise program - the 20/20 program http:// www.2020lifestyles.com/ - and during a pre-entry physical, was diagnosed with Type 2 diabetes. After learning how to control his diabetes, he slowly started dropping about a pound a week until his official start of the 20/20 program in July. For the first few weeks, it was 5+ pounds a week: then 3 pounds, then 2 pounds, and 6 months later he's still losing around 1.5 pounds per week. Adam's blood sugar is now 100% normal and no longer needs diabetes medication. He's down to 200 pounds - 78 pounds and counting - and has a goal to be between 180 and 170 pounds when he's completed with the program. He is in the best shape of his life; for example, he can run a 5k on the treadmill in 28:16, and is improving that time every week. Adam works out 5 days a week and eats about 1800 calories a day to keep this up. Adam's had to throw out nearly all his old clothes at this point.

Besides his health, Adam is now in his 13th year at Microsoft, manages a team of about 20 people, continues to travel regularly to China and to universities in the US for recruiting, and was named the Chief College Officer for the Expression Product Unit this year.

Brenda has been losing weight along with Adam as he's been doing the 20/20 program, and she has dropped 20



pounds so far. She's super excited to fit into clothes that she hadn't been able to wear for some time. She's been going to the gym two or three times a week. Learning how to cook diabetic/health friendly has been both challenging and rewarding for her. Trying to do home school, work around the public school schedule for Christian, transport kids to seminary, baseball, basketball, football, volleyball, scouts, church dances, and work has been a little overwhelming. She's grateful that Aaron is finally driving and has his own car to help her out. Brenda turned 40 in July-but her philosophy is that you're as young as your kids (and your hairdresser) make you feel!

Adam and Brenda took a short trip to Hawaii in October for Brenda's sister's wedding there. It was a nice break for them both. They visited the Polynesian Cultural Center, the BYU Hawaii campus, the LDS temple in Laie, and spent lots of time enjoying the beach and snorkeling. They celebrated their

21st Anniversary in early December, and will be returning to Cancun in late January for a much needed vacation.

#### The Lamb Is My Shepherd




