Dear family:

Another year has come and gone, and we're as busy as ever.

Adam's job continues to keep him busy. He shipped Version 3 of Expression studio mid-year and is working on Version 4. Adam travelled again to Shanghai in July (2009) and plans to be there again in January 2010. At church, Adam was called to serve as elder's quorum president in the springtime, which means lots of Sunday meetings, but it's a tremendous service opportunity that we feel is a blessing for our family. Adam has continued to work out regularly this year and has been able to maintain his weight in the 180s with normal blood sugar levels now. Adam ran a 10k and two 5ks this year (the 10k in 53:45, and the last 5k under 25:00), and is thinking about a win-



ter 10 miler, as well as another 10k on the way to a half marathon. Typical weeks include three weight lifting sessions a week and about 20 miles running.

Brenda has continued to exercise and eat healthier this year (2009). She has been able to keep the 20 pounds off that she lost over the past 18 months or so. She started running in August when Adam came back from Shanghai and ran a 5k for the first time ever. She is currently still teaching the 8 year olds in primary, but will be changing to the calling of primary chorister at the beginning of January. Brenda has realized the value of good friends and family through some experiences that she had over the summer. She also misses Aaron more than she thought she would. Two years is a long time for a mother not to see her son. She didn't realize how hard letting him go would be.

Aaron turned 21 in September and wrapped up his job at Trader Joe's in December (2009) as he had turned in his mission papers several months back. He received his mission call in early November and is now at the MTC in Provo. He will report around January 1 (2010) to the New Mexico Albuquerque mission. We are very proud of his decision and very excited for him.

Garrison turned 16 in March and continues to play piano and guitar in his spare time, and started dating this year. He goes to every church dance that he can. He is a texting freak. He is 6 feet tall now, almost as tall as Aaron. When Aaron comes
